Houghton Academy was founded as Houghton Wesleyan Methodist Seminary in 1883 by the Wesleyan Methodist Church, under the leadership of Willard J. Houghton. The first diploma was awarded to Melvin Eugene Warburton of Overton, Pennsylvania, on June 15, 1888. The school received its charter from the State of New York in October 1907. In 1955, the Seminary, which had shared administration, faculty and campus facilities with Houghton College, became an independent entity and was renamed Houghton Academy. The Academy now occupies a 25-acre campus for grades 6-12 drawing students from the local area and around the world. Philip G. Stockin has served as Headmaster since 1983. Houghton Academy is fully accredited by both the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools and the Association of Christian Schools International.
